

If you pass your interview, you will take the Oath of Allegiance to the United States. Once you have taken the oath, you are officially a U.S. citizen—congratulations!



Do you qualify for the fee waiver?

Some people do not have to pay the application fee. Bring any of these documents to your appointment and the NYCitizenship Lawyer can tell you if you qualify for a fee waiver:

- Food stamp award letter (call 718-722-8009)
- ☐ SSI award letter (call 1-800-772-1213)
- ☐ Medicaid award letter (call 718-557-1399) or visit your Medicaid office
- ☐ Tax returns
- Other proof of income

If you qualify for a fee waiver, the NYCitizenship lawyer can also help you complete the paperwork.

» Check your mail. USCIS will send you all notifications
